The Ruth Pilger Andrews Organ Scholarship Fund

In 1996, the Ruth Pilger Andrews Fund was established by the Association of Church Musicians with a generous bequest from the estate of Ruth Pilger Andrews. Since that time, additional donations to the fund have been accepted and annual concerts have been held to augment the endowment. Awards from this fund assist applicants in furthering their organ studies.

Ruth Pilger Andrews (1905 - 1996), a distinguished Madison organist, was born in Yorktown, Illinois. At age 3, her family moved to Ripon, Wisconsin, where she received her pre-graduate education. She completed a master's degree in French from UW-Madison, where she also studied organ with Professor Irene Eastman. During the 1930s and 1940s, she travelled to Chicago to study with the composer Leo Sowerby. She was the principal organist at Luther Memorial Church for ten years and at the Unitarian Gathering House from 1950 to 1970. As founding member of the Madison chapter of the American Guild of Organists (AGO), she served as editor of the AGO newsletter, *The Drawknob*, in which she maintained a weekly column where she reviewed recently published music. In 1989, Andrews began to self-publish and underwrite her own bi-monthly publication, *New Organ Issues*, which circulated around the country. In it, she continued to review newly published organ music. She continued to give private organ lessons until a month before her death.
